### From the President...

#### **Beware Of Email Lie About W-2**

I want to alert you to an email in wide circulation which states that beginning in 2011 the cost of health care paid by an employer will be reported on your W-2 form and then will be taxed as income for the employee (or, in our case, retiree). It is true that employers must report the cost of health care on W-2 forms in 2011. But the claim in the email that this amount will be taxed is a blatant, bald-faced lie intended to scare voters into unseating congressional incumbents who voted for the Health Care Reform Bill. See the article on page 8 for the complete explanation. If you have received this email, don't believe it, and please do not forward it to others. The health insurance amount to be reported on the W-2 form is **NOT TAXABLE**.

#### Good News...

Peralta retirees can take comfort in the action of the Fresno Unified School District Board on June 2. They voted unanimously (7-0) not to appeal the local court's decision declaring the monthly fee the district imposed on Fresno retired teachers' health care benefits to be illegal (See article on page 2). That's a resounding signal that Fresno Unified thinks it cannot get the court decision struck down and that it would be futile to try. Every governing board of a California public institution that has guaranteed retirees lifetime health care benefits – including Peralta - must now realize that trying to modify those benefits is a losing proposition. That's some bright sunshine for Peralta retirees in the midst of the economic gloom.

#### Bad News...

Like virtually every other school district in California, Peralta finds itself struggling to keep its head

### NO APPEAL IN FURA CASE

The Fresno Unified Retirees Association (FURA) has notified PRO that the Fresno Unified School District Board voted 7 - 0 and reported out in open session at their meeting on June 2, 2010, that the District will not appeal Judge Franson's decision to the 5th District Court of Appeals. In that decision Judge Franson ruled that Fresno Unified School District had violated the contractual rights of retirees by charging them for health benefits.

As in the case of Peralta, Fresno Unified had promised free health insurance for life in numerous union contracts and verbal statements. In 2005, the District imposed substantial charges for the insurance. FURA fought back with the lawsuit that resulted in Judge Franson's decision which completely vindicated the retirees' position.

Carole Sarkisian, FURA President, indicated that "This victory is a testament to the extraordinary

above water. The budget picture is dismal, and the district has hired consultants to try to fabricate a lifeboat. The OPEB bonds, which we have seen as fiscal security to fund retiree benefits, have been losing money. In the latest Peralta budget they are listed as a substantial liability. Their fate will be determined in the next few months. Rest assured that PRO leadership will do everything we can to monitor the process and to exert our influence to protect the funding for our benefits. We will keep you posted through the newsletter and in periodic emails as to the latest developments.



#### **PRO Members Receive Deceptive Email About New Health Care Bill**

An email circulated to many PRO members attempts to undermine support for the new health care legislation by incorrectly asserting that employer payments for health insurance will be considered taxable income. The email correctly indicates that employers will have to report the value of health insurance on W-2 forms starting in 2011. However, it goes on to say that individuals will then have to pay taxes on that amount which is totally false.

The new legislation does impose a tax on so-called "Cadillac" health insurance plans. The W-2 reporting requirement was included to allow the government to ascertain if an employer's plan falls into the "Cadillac" category, and if it does there will be a tax on the amount over the cutoff. However, for PCCD retirees it's important to note that Peralta's plan is *not* considered a "Cadillac" plan. In addition the provision does not go into effect until 2018.

The circulating email refers recipients to an article in Kiplinger's Magazine. If you are interested in seeing

The email ends by suggesting that "people have the right to know the truth as there is an election this November." The email circulates fears and rumors precisely so that people will not know the truth.

dedication and tireless work of hundreds and hundreds of retirees, and others, who willingly gave their time, memories and records to support this case. FURA's evidence proved beyond question that the District made a promise of lifetime retirement health benefits, with no premium charges, a promise district employees relied upon through years of lower pay."

There is a September 10, 2010 court date in Judge Franson's courtroom regarding FURA's motion for court costs and attorney fees.
